WHAT IS A SPORTS MEDICINE DOCTOR?

• A sports medicine physician is a doctor that helps people when they get hurt during sports or exercise.

- Take care of people who have sports injuries or injuries from exercising.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

- Go to college and get a bachelor's degree in any subject. Most sports medicine doctors major in fields like exercise science, biology, chemistry, and physics
- · Go to medical school and study with other doctors

SKILLS

- Be able to communicate with patients, so that they understand how to take care of themselves
- Be able to read articles and information about sports medicine, so that they can learn more to help others
- Use critical thinking to figure out what caused an injury, how to help it heal and how to avoid it happening again
- Be able to read new information about sports medicine and use it when they help patients

WHAT IS A DENTIST?

- Pay attention to small details
- Work well with your hands, including being able to use tools
- Help lead your dental office
- Be patient with those that are scared of the dentist
- Perform a task for a long period of time
